AMERICAN INDONESIAN EXCHANGE FOUNDATION (AMINEF)

The American Indonesian Exchange Foundation (AMINEF), established in 1992, is a bi-national non-profit foundation that administers the Fulbright Program in Indonesia. Fulbright and related programs through AMINEF annually award more than 160 scholarships to Americans and Indonesians to study, teach, or conduct original research in a variety of disciplines. Please consult the AMINEF website (www.aminef.or.id) or periodic announcements and leaflets for specific program requirements, criteria for selection, and application deadlines. Grants are competitive, comprehensive, and generally cover tuition and fees, textbook allowance, monthly maintenance, international airfare, and health insurance.

PROGRAMS FOR INDONESIANS

General Program Description

AMINEF annually offers Fulbright scholarships to study in the United States. The primary focus of the Fulbright Program in Indonesia is to promote mutual understanding between the Republic of Indonesia and the United States of America through educational exchange and academic scholarship. Fulbright scholarships are available to Indonesian citizens with the appropriate qualifications as stipulated in the program descriptions listed below.

General Requirements for All Programs:

- leadership qualities
- a good understanding of Indonesian and international cultures
- a demonstrated commitment to the chosen field of study
- a willingness to return to Indonesia upon completion of the Fulbright program

Please note: Clear and concise written Study Objectives and Research Proposals are extremely important factors in being considered for all Fulbright Programs.

Important Required Testing Information

At the time of application, only an Institutional TOEFL score is required. If selected, Master's and Ph.D candidates must take the official iBT TOEFL test, the Graduate Record Examination (GRE for all fields except Law and Business) or Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT for business administration, finance, accounting).

Fulbright Student Program Alumni*

Fulbright student program alumni are not eligible to apply to get a second student grant.

MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAMS

Fulbright Master's Degree Program

Preference will be given to applicants who serve as faculty members of state or private institutions of higher education in Indonesia. However, all qualified individuals are eligible to apply. Applicants will possess:

- a Sarjana (S1) degree with a minimum GPA of 3.00 (4.00 scale)
- a minimum TOEFL score of 550

Deadline: May 31, 2010

Fulbright-Freeport Master's Degree and PhD Program

Fulbright grants for Master's or Ph.D are available to Papuan residents in the following fields: Metallurgy, Geology/Geotechnical Engineering, Mining Engineering, Engineering (Electrical, Civil, Mechanical), Computer Science and Government/International Relations. Applicants will possess:

- KTP from Papua
- a Bachelor (S1) for Master's degree and S2 for Ph.D with a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.00 scale)



EducationUSA ADVISING SERVICE

AMINEF's EducationUSA Advising Service (EAS) is the official Advising Center Overseas affiliated with U.S. Department of State. EAS provides academic services in the areas of information and advising, individual counseling, testing and test preparation, academic skills training, pre-departure orientation, academic record translation, and visa services. In addition, free orientation sessions for those contemplating study in the U.S. are held each Thursday at 1:00 PM, at the Jakarta office.

AMINEF's EducationUSA provides services to U.S. colleges and universities wishing to recruit Indonesian students and scholars. It also provides special academic training (such as courses targeting academic writing or presentation skills) and special test proctoring and assists students in registering to take various international aptitude / achievement tests such as the International TOEFL, GRE, and GMAT.

The computerized facilities at the EAS library offer students Computer-based TOEFL practice, computerized college search capabilities, and access to online and offline information about scholarships and U.S. Campus Visits.

Deadline: May 31, 2010

Fulbright-DIKTI Master's Degree Program

The Directorate General of Higher Education (DIKTI) in cooperation with The American-Indonesian Exchange Foundation (AMINEF) offers the Fulbright-DIKTI Higher Education Grants to **permanent faculty members** of state and private universities to pursue graduate study at U.S. universities in any fields of study with the exception of medical sciences related to patient care or medical training. Applicants will possess:

- a Bachelor degree (S1) with a minimum GPA of 3.00 (4.00 scale)
- a minimum TOEFL score of 550

Deadline: May 31, 2010

Ph. D. PROGRAM

Fulbright Presidential Scholarship Program (Ph.D. Program)

This open competition is for applicants who serve or plan to serve as faculty members of state or private institutions of higher education in Indonesia. Applicants will possess:

- a Master's degree (S2) with a minimum GPA of 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale)
- a determination to take up academic positions in higher education upon their return
- a minimum TOEFL score of 575. A score of 550 will be considered for certain fields

Deadline: May 31, 2010

International Fulbright Science and Technology Award for Ph.D

This scholarship offers 40 awards to be competed worldwide for Ph.D. study at top U.S. institutions in science, technology, or engineering for the 2011-2012 academic year. Fulbright scholarships for this particular program are available to Indonesian citizens with the appropriate qualifications as stipulated below. Applicants will possess:

- a Sarjana (S1) and/or Master's degree (S2) with a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.00 scale)
- Undergraduate students who will complete the degree before August 1, 2011 may apply
- a minimum TOEFL score of 580 at the time of application
- a minimum GRE quantitative score of 700 (GRE test will be required if selected)

Deadline: April 15, 2010

Fulbright-DIKTI Ph.D Program

The Directorate General of Higher Education (DIKTI) in cooperation with The American-Indonesian Exchange Foundation (AMINEF) offers the Fulbright-DIKTI Higher Education Grants to **permanent faculty members** of state and private universities to pursue graduate study at U.S. universities in any fields of study with the exception of medical sciences related to patient care or medical training. Applicants will possess:

- a Master's degree (S2) with a minimum GPA of 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale)
- a minimum TOEFL score of 575 (A score of 550 will be considered for certain fields)

Deadline: May 31, 2010

RESEARCH PROGRAMS

Fulbright Doctoral Dissertation Research Program

This grant is for Indonesian university doctoral (S3) candidates who are in the final stages of writing their dissertation. The grant duration is for a period of three to six months and the research is going to be conducted in the U.S including library research and consultation with professors in the U.S. Applicants should have a minimum TOEFL score of 575 to participate in this program.

Deadline: May 31, 2010

Fulbright-DIKTI Doctoral Dissertation Research Program

This grant is for Indonesian university doctoral (S3) candidates who are in the final stages of writing their dissertation. The grant duration is for a period of three to four months and the research is going to be conducted in the U.S including library research and consultation with professors in the U.S. Applicants should have a minimum TOEFL score of 525 (550 and above is preferable).

Deadline: May 31, 2010

Fulbright Senior Research Program

This research is for Indonesian scholars who have a doctoral degree (S3) and intend to do a three to six months research in the U.S. Although a TOEFL score is not required, the scholars should be able to demonstrate sufficient English language proficiency to conduct research in the U.S.

Deadline: August 31, 2010

Fulbright-DIKTI Senior Research Program

This research is for Indonesian scholars who have a doctoral degree (S3) and intend to do a three to four months research in the U.S. Although a TOEFL score is not required, the scholars should be able to demonstrate sufficient English language proficiency to conduct research in the U.S.

Deadline: August 31, 2010

OTHER PROGRAMS

Fulbright Foreign Language (Indonesian or Javanese) Teaching Assistant (FLTA) Program

Applicants must be English language teachers or currently in training to become an English language teacher and must be able to demonstrate a commitment to English language teaching upon return to Indonesia following the award. The program is for one academic year (9 months) and requires the grantee to teach **Indonesian or Javanese** at U.S. universities for up to 20 hours per week and to enroll in at least two U.S. Studies and/or ESL methodology classes per semester under a full tuition waiver. Applicants can be no older than 29 years of age by October 1, 2010 and must possess a minimum TOEFL score of 550.

Deadline: May 31, 2010

Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program for Mid-Career Professionals

Hubert H. Humphrey fellowships enable Indonesian mid-career professionals to participate in non-degree programs that combine academic coursework at the graduate level with professional development activities in the U.S. for a period of one academic year (9 months). Candidates are typically administrators in leadership positions with a minimum of five years of work experience who represent either the public or non-profit private sectors, including Non-Governmental Organizations (NGO's) who are committed to public service. Researchers, treatment providers, prevention specialists and program planners at governmental or non-governmental organization will be considered for this award. Fields included are: *Agricultural Development/Agricultural Economics; Communications/Journalism; Economic Development; Finance and Banking; Human Resources Management; Public Policy Analysis and Public Administration; Technology Policy and Management; Urban & Regional Planning; and Public Health Policy and Management (including HIV/AIDS policy and prevention, drug abuse education, treatment, and prevention).*

Applicants will possess:

- Sarjana (S1) degree with a minimum GPA of 2.75 (4.00 scale)
- a minimum TOEFL score of 525

Deadline: May 31, 2010

Community College Summit Initiative Program

This international educational exchange program enables individuals from Indonesia to study at a community college in the United States to develop professional skills. Eligible fields are *Business*

Management and Administration; Tourism and Hospitality Management; Health Professions, including Nursing; Media; Information Technology; Agriculture, and Engineering Science. Applicant must:

- have completed a secondary school education (High School Diploma)
- have relevant work experience or be currently working in the field in which they are applying
- have English language skills that provide a basis for enrolling in academic coursework following approximately 6 months of intensive English language study in the U.S.
- a minimum Institutional TOEFL score 500 or TOEIC score 650 (only scores less than 2 years old are valid)

Deadline: November 1, 2010

Note: Preference will be given to applicants with High School diploma. Applicants with D1, D2 or D3 degrees may apply. Applicants with a Bachelor's degree (S1) are eligible if they are applying in a field different from the field of their degree and have relevant work experience in the field for which they are applying. Applicants with MA or Ph.D degrees are not eligible to participate.

Global Undergraduate Exchange Program

The Global UGRAD Program provides scholarships for one semester or one academic year of U.S. Study in a NON-DEGREE Program. All global UGRAD Program participants will be enrolled full-time in undergraduate course work chosen from the US institution's existing curriculum. Students will also be provided with opportunities to participate in up to ten hours of community service per semester and an internship to all academic-year participants. Applicants must:

- enroll in S1 degree programs and have completed their first semester or are entering their 5th semester by the time of application (students of 6th semester and above are not eligible)
- have a minimum Institutional TOEFL score of 500
- Preference will be given to those who have had little or NO experience in the U.S.

Deadline: November 1, 2010

The International Leadership in Education Program (ILEP)

The International Leadership in Education Program (ILEP) offers a semester-long academic program at a U.S. university, including coursework and intensive training in teaching methodologies, curriculum development, teaching strategies for their home environment, educational leadership, as well as tools for teaching. The semester-long program, which will commence in January and conclude in June. Applicants must be:

- Secondary-level, full-time teachers with five or more years of classroom disciplines including: *English as a Foreign Language; Social Studies; Civics; Mathematics; Science.*
- Have a minimum ITP TOEFL of 500

Deadline: May 16, 2010

PRIORITY DISCIPLINES

Fulbright Programs: All disciplines and fields of study are eligible for a Fulbright award as indicated. The Fulbright Program is eligible in some programs to sponsor foreign medical doctors, only if they are engaged in observation and research, NOT in patient care or medical training.

HOW TO APPLY

Candidates should complete the appropriate application forms and return them to AMINEF by the application deadline. Forms are available either by mail, in person at the AMINEF Office, Gedung Balai Pustaka, Lt. 6, Jl. Gunung Sahari Raya 4, Jakarta 10720, or via the AMINEF Website (www.aminef.or.id). Please return to AMINEF your complete application package by the application deadline that includes: ● Completed application form. This includes a clearly written and concise study objective. ● Copy of your most recent, less than two years old, TOEFL score report. ● One letter of reference, either from your current employer or previous lecturer. ● Copy of academic transcript and diploma (English translation). ● Copy of identity document (KTP or passport).

PROGRAMS FOR AMERICANS

Lecturing/Research Faculty Grants

Grants are provided to American scholars to teach and/or conduct research at Indonesian universities for either one or two academic terms. In addition, lecturers/researchers normally participate in other campus activities including thesis advising, assistance with curriculum development, and establishment of educational linkages between American lecturers and researchers and the host institution.

Senior Specialist Grants

The Fulbright Senior Specialists Program is designed to provide short-term academic opportunities (two to six weeks) for U.S. faculty and professionals to visit Indonesia for the purposes of collaboration, lecturing, conducting workshops, curriculum development, institutional planning, all depending on the host institution's interests and needs. The goals of the program are to: increase the participation of leading U.S. scholars and professionals in Fulbright academic exchanges in Indonesia; encourage new activities that go beyond the traditional Fulbright activities of lecturing and research; and promote increased connections between U.S. and non-U.S. post-secondary academic institutions in Indonesia. Indonesian Institutions interested in hosting Senior Specialist must complete a request form specifying why they need a specialist, and return it to AMINEF.

Research Grants for Faculty

American researchers, individually sponsored by Indonesian institutions, engage in formal academic research on approved topics. Researchers may also be asked to present occasional lectures and seminars on topics of interest to the Indonesian host institution. A special visa and research permit are required.

Research Grants for Students

Grants are given for research on approved projects which are usually integral (but not limited) to work toward a master's or doctoral degree. Students must be sponsored by an Indonesian host institution. A special visa and research permit are required.

Fulbright-Hays Pre-doctoral Student and Post-doctoral Faculty Grants

Student and faculty researchers are sponsored by local Indonesian host institutions to conduct formal research on approved topics. Grants are administered jointly by the grantee's university or home institution and the U.S. Department of Education. AMINEF provides logistical assistance to grantees while they are in-country. A special visa and research permit are required.

English Teaching Assistantship (ETA) Grants

English Teaching Assistantship (ETA) grants are provided to U.S. students holding recent Bachelor's or Master's degrees to assist local high school English teachers in Indonesia. Indonesian high schools are encouraged to apply to AMINEF to host an ETA at their schools.
