I am pleased to inform you that applications for the Australian Scholarships are now open.

Australian Scholarships aim to promote sustainable development and excellence in education and offer educational and professional development awards to citizens of the Asia-Pacific region. These opportunities support growth in our region and build enduring links at the individual, institutional and country levels. Awards are available to high achievers from participating countries, including Indonesia. A variety of educational, research and professional development opportunities are available through three main programs:

1. Endeavour Awards

This program offers a wide range of scholarships to undertake a short term and long term study in Australia. To be eligible to apply for this program you will need to demonstrate a high level of English proficiency and arrange your own placement at host institution in Australia. Applications for this program open from 6 April to 31 July 2009 and can be made online.

2. Australian Leadership Awards (ALA)

The Australian Leadership Awards (ALA) program aims to develop leadership, build partnerships and linkages within the Asia-Pacific, and address priority regional issues. The ALA program is comprised of Scholarships and Fellowships. Awardees are selected from the public, private and community sectors within countries where Australia has a significant aid program. Applications for this program open from March to 30 June 2009.

3. Australian Development Scholarships (ADS)

Australian Development Scholarships equip scholars with the skills and knowledge to drive change and influence the development outcomes of their own country through obtaining tertiary qualifications (Master and PhD) at an Australian university. The application period will be from 15 June to 4 September 2009.

Australian Scholarships is an initiative of the Australian Government to promote sustainable development and excellence in education in the Asia-Pacific region.

Australian Scholarships will provide educational, research and professional development opportunities to support growth in the Asia-Pacific region and to build enduring links at the individual, institutional and country levels.

Australian Scholarships demonstrates the high value the Australian Government places on building lasting relationships with countries in the region. The initiative continues the spirit of the Colombo Plan which greatly enhanced common purpose and mutual understanding in the Asia-Pacific region.

International education, both for Australians and regional participants, provides opportunities to establish networks and institutional links, while addressing regional skills shortages and contributing to regional research efforts. The awards also allow Australia to demonstrate the high quality of education it provides for international students.

Australian Scholarships is a whole-of-government approach to education cooperation between Australia and the countries of the Asia-Pacific region. The initiative brings under one umbrella three Australian Government education award programs managed by the Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID) and the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR):

- **Australian Development Scholarships (ADS)** strengthens human resource capacity in Australia's partner countries to contribute to long-term development needs and promote greater stability (AusAID).
- **Australian Leadership Awards (ALA)**, a regional program, aims to develop leadership, build partnerships and links, and address priority issues in the Asia-Pacific region (AusAID).
- **Endeavour Awards** focuses on strengthening education linkages, skills and knowledge throughout the region, while showcasing Australia's excellence in education and training (DEEWR).

The *Australian Scholarships* initiative will support ongoing links with past awardees to encourage and strengthen enduring personal links throughout the region. This will enable the benefits of *Australian Scholarships* to be sustained over time.

Each award program has different priorities, application and selection processes, and provisions for the allocation of awards to individuals and countries. Individual Fact Sheets provide details on each program within the Australian Scholarships initiative.

Applicants must have achieved appropriate results in one of the following English language proficiency test no longer than two years prior to the date of the application.

- IELTS: an overall score of at least 6.5 with no individual band less than 6; OR
- Equivalent TOEFL score (see the AusAID Scholarship webpage for details).

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications are considered annually on a regionally competitive basis. Selection is based on leadership potential and academic merit. Australian High Commissions and Embassies consider applications and recommend short-listed candidates to a final inter-departmental selection committee in Canberra. AusAID prefers online applications.

Applications open mid-March and close 30 June 2009

Applications can be submitted either:

1. Online via the ALA Scholarship online application found on the above website.
2. By mail to the ALA office (address at right).

Application forms can be downloaded from the above website.

How to apply:

1. Obtain a letter of unconditional offer from a participating institution.
2. Obtain English language proficiency certificate.
3. Review thoroughly the terms and conditions of the ALA scholarship via the above website to ensure you understand the scope of the scholarship offer.
4. After mid-March 2009, download the scholarship application information and if necessary the paper based application from the above website.
5. Begin to collect the required documentation and information including referee reports, certified copies of previous academic qualifications and proof of English language proficiency.
6. Submit your online or paper based application before close of business of 30 June 2009. (Paper based applications must be received at the ALA office by 30 June 2009).

Award recipients are drawn from the public, private and community sectors within countries with which Australia has a significant aid program.

Australian Leadership Awards are provided by the Australian Government through the Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID).

ALA Scholarships are academically prestigious awards offered to high achievers from the Asia-Pacific region to undertake postgraduate study (Masters or Doctorate) and a leadership development program in Australia.

Awards are open to all fields of study, although study programs are encouraged in the following priority themes:

Disability, Economic Growth, Education, Climate Change, Food Security, Gender, Governance, Health, Human Rights, Infrastructure, Regional Stability, Rural Development, Water and Sanitation. Postgraduate study must be undertaken at participating Australian higher education institutions.

REALISING YOUR LEADERSHIP POTENTIAL

ALA Scholarships seek to empower awardees to participate in social and economic policy and development outcomes in their own countries and in the region. Awardees are provided a unique opportunity to explore and harness their leadership potential, through a Leadership Development Program (LDP).

The LDP comprises a three day conference in Canberra, regional workshops and leadership coaching and practice opportunities. The LDP increases skills in leadership and enhances participants understanding of the challenges at national, regional and global levels. LDP aims to help scholars realise their full leadership potential and provides important networking and collaborative opportunities for ALAS scholars.

The LDP component of the ALA Scholarship is a valuable opportunity that is not offered through any other scholarship program in the Asia-Pacific region.

VALUE

Australian Leadership Awards Scholarships include the following benefits and support:

- Contribution to living expenses;
- A Leadership Development Program;
- Establishment allowance once you arrive;
- Introductory Academic Program (IAP);
- An annual, accumulative, study enrichment allowance (SEA) to contribute towards field research, academic support, conference participation or the award holder's reunion travel costs;
- Tuition fees;
- Costs associated with health checks and visa applications prior to departure for Australia;
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of the award (awardee only);
- Return air travel to and from Australia;



GENERAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Have achieved a tertiary qualification at least equivalent to an Australian Bachelor's degree.
- Be a citizen of an ALA eligible country.
- Reside in a country other than Australia.
- Not hold Australian or New Zealand citizenship or permanent resident status (unless applying as a citizen of the Cook Islands, Niue and Tokelau).
- Not married to/or defacto of, or engaged to, a person who holds or is eligible to hold Australian or New Zealand citizenship or permanent resident status.
- Meet specified English proficiency requirements and have evidence to support and have received an Unconditional Offer from an Australian university.

WHAT IS AN UNCONDITIONAL OFFER?

An unconditional offer is made by a university based on an application that you submit directly to that university.

An unconditional offer does not require you to complete any preliminary courses or to provide the university further evidence before you can be admitted. If an institution places any conditions on their offer to you, these conditions must be met before you submit your application to AusAID.
